



Please find general information below about planned curriculum and activities for your child across Year 2 this term. Please take time to read the school newsletter each fortnight to keep up to date with school events.

English

This term we look at factual texts. We look at the purpose, audience and structure of these texts, and how they differ from narrative texts. Students will be writing an information report on an animal. We will also explore procedural texts (instructions).

Mathematics

We begin looking at numbers over 100 and continue working with 2 digit addition and subtraction. Where necessary students will continue to consolidate their knowledge of 2 digit numbers prior to moving onto 3 digits. We also work with fractions, money, measurement and movement (flip, slides and turns).

HASS

History focuses on changes in technology that have occurred over time. Students develop an understanding of the impact that changing technology has had on people's lives.

Science—Physics

Students explore push and pull forces, and observe and gather evidence about how these forces act in air and water, and on the ground.

Health

Students describe changes as they grow older. They identify how emotional responses impact on others' feelings and select and apply strategies to keep themselves safe and ask for help with tasks or problems.

The Arts

This term students will explore Visual Arts. They will study the work of an Australian artist and create their own interpretation of an art piece.

Homework

Homework will continue in a similar vein to Semester One homework. It is comprised of two parts – reading and spelling. If you have any questions around homework, please contact your class teacher.
