



Please find general information below about planned curriculum and activities for your child across Year 3 this term.

### English

This term in English we are examining imaginative narratives and information reports. Children will read and comprehend an imaginative text and write an information report.

### HASS

This semester in HASS, we are studying places near and far. Children will explore how and why places are similar and different. They will represent and compare data about places and explain the importance of making decisions democratically and the roles of rules in the community.

### Health

This term in Health, children will explore the concept of sustainable practice and the ways that they can contribute to the sustainability of the environment within their home, school and classroom.

### Mathematics

During the term, our strong focus will continue to be on aspects of number to 10 000, problem solving, fractions and further consolidation of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division number facts. We will also cover units of measurement relating to mass, length, capacity, time and money.

### Science

This term in Science, we are studying the relationships between the Sun, Earth and Moon to understand how we experience day and night. Children will conduct an investigation into how shadows change in relation to the apparent movement of the Sun throughout the day.

### The Arts— Drama

Within Performing Arts, children will plan and create a group item to be presented to the class. They will explore a range of drama techniques that can be used in their performance.

### Excursions, events and activities

**Book Week** celebrations will be held during Week 6. Children are requested to dress up as their favourite character and bring their book to parade on Friday 24th August.
